estination TEXAS: Super Mileage team gears up for Spring Break trip south in first race of the year

Over Spring Break some people travel, some people stay home and some people go to Discovery Green Park and Science Center in Houston, Texas to race

Over Spring Break, the Paoli Super Mileage team will be headed to Texas to race their car in the Shell Eco Marathon.

Members of the Super Mileage team include: Garrett Sanders, Garrett Shepard, Colton Phelps, Skylar Hodges, Devin Durbin, Ben Bosley, Trevor Axsom, A.J. Fulkerson, Lee Apple, Jacob Smitson, Ron Compton, Wes Phelps and Frank Calzada. This year the team is thirteen members strong and they are ready to compete.

The team has been around for a total of three years. Up until now, the team has only competed at the Lucas Oil Raceway in Indianapolis for the IMSTEA, or the Indiana Math, Science, Technology & Engineering Association's Super Mileage Challenge. This year, along with the competition at Indy, the team will head to Texas.

"The Shell Eco Marathon is open to high schools and colleges across North America opening up the competition," said teacher and coach Jason Goodman. "The purpose of the Super Mileage team is to design and build a one person vehicle capable of high fuel efficiency."

One reason for the team going to Texas for competition is that the design rules are more open to creativity and more complex designs than with IMSTEA.

While at the competition, students will also have an opportunity to talk with vendors, colleges and representatives that will speak about college and job prospects. In the past, the team has won the Performance Concept Award, meaning they had the closest calculation of fuel mileage. The team calculated that their car would run 300 miles per gallon and the car went 321 miles per gallon.

The team goes to Indianapolis April 29 and 30.

"The students had to raise money to help pay for gas for the drive there and

back, and for the hotel stays on the way there and back. The actual contest is free and Shell provides three meals a day and free housing for team members while in Texas." said Goodman.

The 13 members of the team started to design their high-efficiency gas mileage car at the beginning of the school year and they believe that they will be a contender in Texas. Their goal for this year is for their car to get above 500 miles per gallon. The team spent approximately \$3,000 on their car for this year.

"We raised most of the money from sponsors or we had sponsors make or donate a part. We also recycled some parts from last year's car, such as the wheels," said Goodman.

This year the two drivers of the car are seniors Trevor Axsom and Skylar Hodges. As a class, the team decides who is small and lightweight and then designs the vehicle around those specific people. Only people who are licensed drivers are allowed to drive the car at the competitions that the team competes in.

The team hopes to have a successful finish at both of their contests this year. When they go to Texas, they will be competing against 90 other teams. They are looking to have a car that goes at least 500 miles per gallon. They have spent thousands of dollars on their car and some people have even chosen to donate parts.

Over Spring Break, the team will head to Texas. Hopefully the Paoli Super Mileage team returns to Indiana with a great win with their car.
